
Phonics games and activities for the Initial Code: Sounds-Write photocopiable activity book (Initial Code)

This Sounds-Write workbook for the Initial Code contains over 190 activities to practise word reading, word writing and sentence reading; it also contains speed reading and memory games and word searches. The games and activities provide beginning readers with the opportunity to practise their reading and writing in fun and engaging ways. The activities can be used whole class, in small groups and in one-to-one settings, as well as for homework or home schooling.



2.1 Word reading

Ask the student to say the sounds and read the word, and then to match it with the correct picture.



3.6 Cut and stick

Cut up the sentences (or let the student do that). Ask the student to read each sentence and stick it under the correct picture. Once they've done that, as them to read the sentence again.



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



2.4 Word reading and writing: sound leel


Ask the students to say the sounds and read each of the words below

When they have read each word successfully, ask them to cover it by folding the page forwards on the line to hide the word, and then write it, saying the sounds as they do. When they have written the word, ask them to read it back once more to make sure the word they wrote was the one they wanted to write. Then they can unfold the page to check they have written it correctly.

Note that the number of lines represent the number of sounds in the word, and that when a

Example: 'week' has three sounds, /w/ /ee/ /k/, so there are three lines for it and the student should write it like this: \underline{w} ee \underline{k} .

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1.6 Four-in-a-Row game: sound /ae/

This is a game for two players. Each player chooses a different-coloured marker. They take it in turns to read a word on the grid and cross out the word they have just read with their coloured marker (but they HAVE TO SAY THE SOUNDS AND READ THE WORD out loud)). The aim of the game is to be the first to form a horizontal, vertical, or diagonal line of four words in one's own colour.

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




Fact File: Countries Series


Like the Fact File: Animal Series, this collection of informational texts also complements the teaching of a knowledge curriculum. The eight books in this collection are aimed at children in Y2 or Y3, including in an intervention setting. Children will develop their knowledge of countries - geography, culture, peoples - as well as practising more spellings of the sounds they've been learning.

They start with a review of the Initial Code with Japan and continue through the Extended Code to < oo > with the Cook Islands.
